Snow Report

So Gotham Primary remained open when many other schools in Rushcliffe and across the country could not. As a HT it is *my* responsibility to open our school if it is safe for me to do so—and as parents it is *your* responsibility to bring your child to school if it is possible to do so. Only 78 of our 196 pupils live in the village and can walk to school, so it was encouraging that 112 children attended on Thursday 1st March and 138 made it in to school on Friday 2nd. Well Done!



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We have decided to revisit the 3B4ME strategy which we learned from an RLA INSET Day. The idea is that children can refer to a menu of strategies for helping them to move on if they become temporarily stuck during the independent learning part of a lesson. This is designed to build up their academic resilience and selfsufficiency because it gives children the power and permission to become more independent learners and not rely so heavily on adult support.

Obviously the teacher or TA is still there to move children on, and they will do this when children have tried out three independent strategies first.

3B4ME Look Use your Ask a around the brain... friend... room... Move on Look in a Try again... (and then book go back) Then ask your **Teacher or TA!**

We have renegotiated our contract with Teachers2Parents to improve our communication with you.

From now on each child in school has two T2P contact numbers, and both will automatically receive any texts which we send out from school. We are limited to a maximum of two contacts per child only.

We still have a number of Grandparents set up as a separate group, but they will not automatically receive information texts unless it relates directly to them and the Grandparents events to which they have been invited throughout the year.
