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## Updated National Framework for Penalty Notices

As many of you will already have heard in the news, the government have updated their framework for fixed penalty notices for unauthorised absence. The updates come into force from August 2024, I am letting you know now so that you are aware when booking family holidays. In September, our attendance policy will be updated to include the following information.

- Under the new national framework, fines will be considered when a child has missed 10 or more sessions ( 5 days) for unauthorised reasons.
- The fine for unauthorised school absences across the country will be $£ 80$ if paid within 21 days, or $£ 160$ if paid within 28 days.
- If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within any three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of $£ 160$.
- Fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action like a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.
- If you're prosecuted and attend court because your child hasn't been attending school, you could get a fine of up to $£ 2,500$.
- Money raised via fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

Please bear in mind when booking holidays, that no holidays are authorised unless there is an exceptional circumstance. Fines are per child, per parent. From September, holidays will be looked at over a 3-year period.
