Sport and P.E. at GPS





Last academic year, we changed how we provided our sports provision and no longer use a sports coaching provider in the same way. I know there was a feeling of disappointment for some but the change was made to enhance our provision and give us greater flexibility and the opportunity to be involved in more sport. This half term, Jimmy 'Jumpshot' Smith has been coaching our year 5 and 6s in basketball. We are also taking part in 7 basketball tournaments. We have attended the Rushcliffe Schools' Boys and Girls football tournaments with children from years 4, 5 and 6 on two Saturday mornings and we have a girls' football match this week. Within school, we have bought into a new PE scheme, which is extremely supportive for staff and develops a progression for sports knowledge and skills from FS2 up to year 6. Over the year, we will continue to extend our sporting provision and opportunities for children.

Mastering Number FS2, Year 1 & Year 2

This year, we are enhancing our maths provision with the support of training from the East Midlands Maths Hub. All children in FS2, year 1 and year 2 will be having mastering number sessions as part of their maths teaching. The aim of this programme is:

- To develop fluency in calculation and number sense for all children
- To enable all pupils to clearly communicate their mathematical ideas

During some of these sessions, the children will use rekenreks. Rekenreks are ideal for building number sense. They provide pupils with a concrete, physical object to help develop and deepen their understanding of numbers. Students build a strong sense of 5 and 10, learning about the relationships between numbers and operations. Here is a rekenrek.

The school's mission statement of 'Being the best we can be together!' represents the aspirational ethos and family feeling at Gotham.

Classrooms are positive and peaceful places to learn. Pupils are polite and well-behaved. They know that bullying is not tolerated.

Teachers revisit what pupils have learned before. Pupils know why this is important. Pupils in Year 3 told inspectors, 'We do retrieval practice – we go over things from Year 1 and Year 2, so we don't forget.'

Pupils told inspectors, 'We do a lot of recapping in our lessons so the maths goes from our working memory into our long-term memory.'

Pupils value diversity and celebrate difference. They told inspectors, 'People should be treated the same way. There is no difference between people. We all have the same rights.'

Governors know the school well. They understand its strengths and areas for development. Governors have challenged and supported leaders to make improvements to the curriculum.
